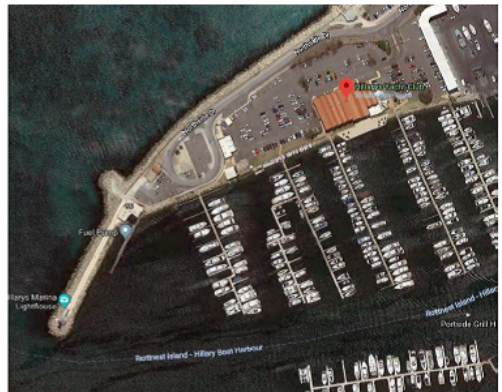

INTRODUCTION

The Angling Section is a friendly, family orientated group of members of varying ages and lifestyles who are actively involved in recreational and competitive fishing, whether it be from either a boat or beach.

The Section conducts monthly Boat Angling competitions, Beach Competitions and the annual Open Harbour Classic event. Depending on numbers and crew availability, weekly boat fishing trips also take place.

The season runs from July 2026 to June 2027, culminating in the annual Angling Presentation Dinner. All Club members are invited to join in the activities of the Angling Section.

INSHORE AND DEEP-SEA FISHING

Fish from your own boat or fish from the Club vessel Alibi which is also involved in the regular fishing trips and boat competitions. The monthly Boat Angling Competition generally takes place on the third Sunday of each month (see Angling Section Calendar on page 10 or HYC website). Members intending to go out fishing on the Club boat need to enter their names in the boat book at HYC reception up to one week prior to the fishing day. There are also opportunities for weekly inshore fishing trips on Wednesdays (dependent on weather and bookings) start at 7am, with the boat returning by 2pm. Cost depends on the running time of the boat motor. Please contact reception or on-water events coordinator (9246 2833) if interested.

JUNIORS WELCOME

Our very popular Junior Fishing Clinics during school holidays are an excellent introduction into recreational angling, teaching juniors on how to use fishing gear and identify and handle fish correctly. They will also be introduced to the concept of 'fishing for the future' by learning about minimum sizes, bag limits and open and closed seasons for certain species. A weigh in for the fish caught enhances these processes prior to the closure of the clinic.

Monthly section meetings are held at the Club on the second Monday of each month, commencing at 7:00pm. All Club Members are welcome to attend. The schedule for boat competitions and beach competitions are specified in the handbook.



CODE OF PRACTICE

LOOK AFTER OUR FISHERIES

1. Take no more than your immediate needs.
2. Understand and observe all fishing regulations.
3. Support and encourage activities that restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitats.

PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT

4. Remove rubbish to prevent pollution and to protect wildlife.
5. Use established roads and tracks wherever possible.
6. Take care when boating and anchoring to avoid damaging sensitive areas.
7. Report environmental damage and pollution to the relevant authorities.

RESPECT THE RIGHT OF OTHERS AND FISH HUMANELY

8. Quickly and correctly return unwanted or illegal catch to the water.
9. Use only legal tackle, attend your gear and value your catch.
10. Obtain permission to enter land and respect the rights of all to use the waterways.



BOAT & BEACH COMPETITIONS



SPECIES ANGLING COMPETITION

The competitions and point scoring system are based on catching a conservative number of nominated fish species, not just the heaviest bag of fish. An angler's catch shall include the heaviest ONE of each nominated species in their bag to be weighed in. The inclusion of more than one of any nominated species in the weigh in bag may result in a penalty. Whenever in doubt, check with the weigh in officer prior to the start of the weigh in. Other fish can be weighed in for records, before or after the competition weigh in.

POINTS SYSTEM & PRIZES SPECIES COMP

An Anglers competition score comprises a combination of factors including points for attendance, number of species and bag weight, as follows:

1. 10 points for competitors signing on/off prior to the weigh in.
2. The first eligible specie is awarded 7 points with 1 point per specie thereafter on a graduating scale as follows:
 - 1st specie – 7 points = 7 points
 - 2nd specie – 8 points (+7) = 15 points
 - 3rd specie – 9 points (+15) = 24 points
 - Etc.

3. Total bag weight x 2 points per kilogram and/or part thereof.
4. A maximum weight of up to 10kg for Samson Fish and Sharks.
5. The categories of Section Winners for each monthly Species boat and beach competition include:
 - Men's highest point scorer
 - Ladies highest point scorer
 - Junior highest point scorer
 - Mini Junior highest point scorer

Should there be less than two competitors in any category, the participant will participate in the Mens category.

6. In the event of equal category points, the winner is the competitor with the greatest number of species. If this is the same, then the bag with the heaviest single fish will determine the category winner.
7. Additional prizes are also awarded for the heaviest of each species relevant to the competition caught on the day with a prize also being available to the winner of the "chocolate wheel"

COMPETITION ENTRY

Entry to the competition is open to all members of Hillarys Yacht Club along with invited guests and potential members who can compete as "Visitors" up to three times.

Categories and age breaks:

- Men's and Ladies: 17 years and over on the 1st of August of that year
- Juniors: Aged between 8 and 16 years on the 1st of August of that year
- Mini-Juniors: Under 8 years on the 1st of August of that year

BOAT COMPETITION TIMES

Specific competition start times and end times vary see calendar of events for details.

Sign-on: a weather report including confirmation of competition

go-ahead (rule 26) and a signon sheet will be in the Wet Bar on competition days approximately 1 hour prior to the event start time. The Section has also implemented a WhatsApp group which the FDO uses to provide alternative confirmation of comp go-ahead.

Sign on: options by electronic means are being investigated by the section. For safety, please also ensure to log-on and log-off with Whitfords Sea Rescue call sign VJ6LQ.

Sign-Off: for safety reasons all competitors MUST SIGN OFF directly or via a proxy regardless of whether they are weighing in any fish or not. Whitfords Sea Rescue will be notified of any angler not accounted for 30 minutes after weigh in commences (see rule 20).

Weigh in at Hillarys Yacht Club (unless specified otherwise).

BEACH COMPETITION TIMES

Competition start and end times vary, see event details (Rule 6)

Sign-on: a sign on sheet will generally be in the Wet Bar prior to the event start (unless specified otherwise - typically for away events sign on is by text message to an allocated person).

Sign-Off: for safety reasons all competitors MUST SIGN OFF directly or via a proxy regardless of whether they are weighing in any fish or not.

COMPETITION RULES

If a competitor breaches a competition rule the FDO has discretion to note the breach, disqualify the competitor, or refer the matter to the disputes committee for a decision. The FDO may disqualify the competitor automatically for breaching rules 2, 4, 6, 8, 9 or 16. In any case the matter may be requested to be referred to the Disputes Committee for consideration.

1. All competitors must sign on prior to competing in the competition. For local competitions, there will be a sign on sheet in the Wet Bar (or electronic version will be available during the year) 45 minutes before commencement of the competition on the day. New skippers must complete the Skippers Boat Registration Form. For beach comps, competitors will message a nominated person prior to fishing.
2. All competitors must not leave any harbour before the start time set for the competition in the Angling Calendar, or the start time as amended by the Field Day Officer on the day (see Weather Rule).
3. All competitors MUST SIGN OFF at the weigh-in or via a proxy.
4. Undersized or protected species presented in the weigh in area after commencement of the weigh in will result in automatic disqualification.
5. For Section competitions, fish can be presented for weigh-in cloth bags, hessian bags, insulated eskies, insulated bags or similar container designed for keeping the contents cool. No fish should be caught and kept in plastic bags unless they are in a cooler described previously.
6. Competitors' bags must be in the weigh-in area prior to the commencement of the weigh-in.
7. Competitors' bags in the weigh-in area must contain ONE ONLY of each nominated species listed on page 15 in this document. If the bag contains more than one of a nominated species, then that species will be removed from the competitors bag and the competitor will receive zero points for that species.
8. All rays or similar, gurnards or other poisonous species are NOT ALLOWED IN THE WEIGH-IN AREA. Weighing these fish for records shall be recognised after consultation with the Field Day Officer/ Weigh-In Officer only.
9. All fish must comply with competition nominated species minimum size list and Fisheries Department minimum size standards. Nominated species without legal size shall have competition minimum size of 200mm or as nominated by the Angling Committee.

10. Mutilated fish will not be accepted for weigh in. Gilled or gutted fish are acceptable with no adjustment allowance for the lost weight.
11. Disputes must be reported to the Field Day Officer within 10 minutes of the close of the weigh-in. A Dispute Committee shall adjudicate on all disputes and their decision shall be final. The Dispute Committee will consist of three Angling Committee members nominated by, but excluding, the Field Day Officer.
12. The Field Day Officer and/or Angling Committee shall have the right to vary arrangements and rules to contribute to the smooth running of competitions.
13. LATE WEIGH-IN EXEMPTIONS. A competitor delayed due to towing a boat in distress can be considered for a late weigh-in, however, this exemption will not apply to competitors on the boat in distress.
14. In the event of a fish being hooked in or through the mouth by more than one competitor, specie(s) and weight points will be shared. Total points allocated will not exceed those available to a single angler.
15. All fish must be caught by the competitor weighing in. Each angler must hook and bring in their own fish. They may receive help in gaffing, gilling or landing, without the assistant handling the competitors rod, reel or line.
16. A competitor must not use more than two rods or handlines at any one time, and each rod or line must not have more than two hooks. (A flight or hooks joined is considered to be one hook).
17. All boats must comply with the Department of Transport, Boat Regulations as applicable.
18. Boat pairing is recommended for safety.
19. Radio communications during competitions is on 27.96MHz (Ch 96) or VHF 72.
20. Prior to competing, for your own safety please log on with Whitfords Sea Rescue on VJ6LQ on VHF 77 or 27.90MHz (Ch 90).
21. Remember to LOG OFF at the end of the day. Whitfords Sea Rescue Tower phone number is 08 9401 3757. If competitors have not logged off or advised the Club within 30 minutes of closure time (4:30pm), Whitfords Sea Rescue will be contacted and advised the anglers in question are listed as overdue.
22. All competitors in the angling competitions or participating in any Angling Section events, do so entirely at their own risk, and Hillarys Yacht Club Inc. and /or any associated Committee(s) will not be held responsible for any loss or damage incurred during the event.
23. At the conclusion of the June competition, the Records Officer will calculate:
 - The final Boat Competition score for each angler will be calculated by adding their best 'X' monthly competition scores together.

The number of competitions 'X' will be determined each year based on the total number of species competitions.

- The final Beach Competition score for each angler will be calculated by adding all their beach competition scores together.

24. End of year trophies can only be won by financial Club Members.

25. 'MOST RECORDS CAUGHT' Trophy will only be assessed from fish weighed in during Club competitions.

26. WEATHER RULE

Strong Wind Warning

For local boating events, if a Strong Wind Warning is issued by the Bureau of Meteorology at the 4:30 am report on the competition day for any period 4:30am to 12:00 midnight for Perth Local Waters: Two Rocks to Dawesville, inshore from Rottnest Island, the competition for that day is automatically cancelled.

In the event of inclement weather, the competition may be cancelled or the start time may be delayed for up to one hour depending on circumstances. A subcommittee of a Field Day Officer and two other Club members nominated by him/her will make the decision to fish or not. If it is decided that the competition is cancelled, the competition shall be postponed until the next available Sunday in the month (see Angling Calendar). If conditions on the next alternate Sunday are deemed unfavourable, the competition will be cancelled for that month. The decision of this committee is final.



Competitors should not knowingly discard whole fish caught prior, during or after any event, subject to the severity of the incident, further action may be taken by the clubs executive committee.
