## Dinghy Sailing Instructions 2024/25

#### 1 RULES

- 1.1 Races will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 The Australian Sailing Special Regulations and relevant Class Rules will apply (unless altered by these Sailing Instructions). All boats are required to submit a completed equipment audit form.
- 1.3 Appendix T Arbitration shall apply, except that a Post-Race Penalty shall be a scoring penalty equal to a finishing place mid-way between the boat's actual finishing place and the score for a disqualification. Half points shall be disregarded. This changes T1 (b).
- 2 ELIGIBILITY
- 2.1 Boats shall register online prior to competing in a race in a series. Only boats registered at the Club may compete in club races unless the race is designated as an invitation race or unless otherwise approved by the Dinghy Captain.
- 2.2 Boats shall be helmed and crewed by financial members of Hillarys Yacht Club unless otherwise approved by the Dinghy Captain.
- 3 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices will be posted on the official Dinghy Division Notice Board, located inside or near the Junior Club House.

- 4 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS
- 4.1 Any change to the Sailing Instructions or schedule of races will be posted on the official Dinghy Division Notice Board, as specified in SI 3, not less than one hour prior to the scheduled warning signal of the races for which it will take effect.
- 4.2 Flag 'L' will be displayed from the mast on the HYC Junior Clubhouse.
- 4.3 Changes to the Sailing Instructions may be made on the water in accordance with RRS 90.2(c) using the following procedure:

a) Flag 'L' to be displayed with a sound signal. Competitors should come within hailing distance of the Committee Boat.

b) Instructions may be given orally or by displaying a notice on the Committee Boat.

Failure to receive these instructions will not be grounds for redress.

- 5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE
- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the mast on the HYC Junior Clubhouse.
- 5.2 When Flag AP is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 30 minutes" in the RRS Race Signals.
- 6 SAFETY REGULATIONS
- 6.1 All boats shall comply with the requirements of the Australian Sailing Special Regulations Part 2.
- 6.2 All boats intending to race shall complete 'Sign On' sheets located in or in the vicinity of the Junior Club House. All boats shall complete 'Sign Off' sheets located in or in the vicinity of the Junior Club House within 60 minutes of the last boat's finish time in the last race of every session. Boats failing to 'Sign Off' will be scored 1 place more than their last race for the day.
- 7 SCHEDULE OF EVENTS
- 7.1 Scheduled race dates, start times, training events and Club approved regattas are shown in Appendix A "Dinghy Calendar". Where Appendix A includes reference to social events, events conducted by other clubs or sailed under alternative special Sailing Instructions, these do not form part of these Sailing Instructions.
- 7.2 Any changes to start times in the 2022/2023 "Dinghy Calendar" will be displayed on the official Dinghy Division Notice Board as specified in SI 4.1.
- 8 CLASS FLAGS
- 8.1 Class Flags are shown below:



- 8.2 Fleets may be combined for starts, and may all start under the same class flag as designated by the Race Officer during the briefing.
- 9 RACING AREA

The racing area will be in waters adjacent to Hillarys Boat Harbour.

- 10 THE COURSES
- 10.1 All courses are as detailed in Appendix B.
- 10.2 The course will be signalled on the Race Committee Boat or Start Tower by displaying the corresponding numeral pennant no later than the warning signal.

- 11 MARKS
- 11.1 Marks will be yellow or red or pink inflatable buoys. The Optimist class will use orange pimple buoys for marks 1A or 2A.
- 11.2 Any replacement marks will be red inflatable buoys.
- 12 THE START
- 12.1 Races will be started in accordance with RRS 26.
- 12.2 BOAT STARTS

The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee Boat at the starboard end and the course side of an orange buoy with a pole and orange flag at the port end. A clearance buoy may be streamed from the Race Committee Boat. This buoy is deemed to be part of the Race Committee Boat for the purpose of RRS 31 and shall be passed on the same side as the Race Committee Boat when starting.

12.3 TOWER STARTS

The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Start Tower and the course side of an orange buoy with a pole and orange flag.

- 12.4 Boats whose class warning signal has not been made shall keep clear of both the starting area and all boats who are in the starting sequence.
- 12.5 LATE STARTER

A boat starting later than 10 minutes after the starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A4.

13 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

To change the next leg of the course, the Race Committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practical. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.

14 THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Committee Boat or the Start Tower and the course side of the finishing mark.

- 15 TIME LIMITS
- 15.1 The time limit for the first boat in each race is 1 hour 10 minutes.
- 15.2 Boats failing to finish within 20 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes RRS Rules 35.

#### 16 PENALTY SYSTEM

Penalties shall be in accordance with RRS Rule 44.

#### 17 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 17.1 Protests shall be written on forms available from the Start Tower. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.
- 17.2 For each class, the protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later.
- 17.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses and where the hearings will be held.
- 17.4 Notices of protests by the Race Committee or protest committee will be posted to inform boats under RRS 61.1(b).
- 18 SCORING
- 18.1 The Low Point Scoring system of RRS Appendix A as amended by SI 19.2.
- 18.2 RRS A4 shall be amended as follows:
  - 18.2.1 A boat that completes 'Sign On' for a race day in the series but does not start shall be scored DNS and awarded points for the finishing place one more than the number of boats that 'Signed On'.
  - 18.2.2 A boat that does not complete 'Sign On' for a race day in the series, shall be scored DNC and awarded points for the finishing place two more than the number of boats that 'Signed On'.
- 18.3 Handicap results may occur at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- 18.4 An A and B fleet results split may occur if fleet sizes permit and it is deemed appropriate by the Race Committee.
- 19 NUMBER OF RACES TO COUNT

See Appendix C to the Sailing Instructions.

- 20 AVERAGE POINTS
- 20.1 Boats representing Hillarys Yacht Club in official class State, National and International events may apply for average points to be awarded for Club Championship, Club Consistency and Winter Series races held on the same day. Consideration may also be given for participation in Club approved events.
- 20.2 The number of races for which average points may be granted is limited to:

- 20.2.1 One race day for the Summer Club Championship Series
- 20.2.2 One race day for the Winter Series
- 20.2.3 Two race days for the Summer Club Consistency Series, with up to an additional 2 race days for Club approved coaching activities.
- 20.3 Application for average points shall be made in writing to the Rear Commodore of Sail at least 7 days before the HYC race day, detailing the alternative sailing event and reason for absence. The Rear Commodore of Sail will consult with the Dinghy Captain and Results Officer before reaching a decision.
- 20.4 Average points shall be calculated by the Results Officer from the points accrued in all the races that the requesting boat competed in during the series.
- 21 SUPPORT BOATS
- 21.1 Support boats will be appointed by the Race Committee and will be identified by a flag with green over white diagonal halves.
- 21.2 Actions by race committee boats will not be subject to protest or request for redress.
- 21.3 Competing boats shall give right of way to support boats at all times.
- 21.4 Coaching will be permitted during Club race days.
- 22 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

- 23 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY
- 23.1 The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone. All those taking part in the event do so at their own risk.
- 23.2 The Organizing Authority, its associates and appointees accept no responsibility for any loss, damage, injury or inconvenience incurred, howsoever caused.
- 23.3 Attention is also drawn to Fundamental Rule 4 which states "A boat is solely responsible for deciding whether or not to start or continue racing" and Australian Sailing Special Regulations Part 2 1.02.1 which states inter alia that "The safety of a boat and her crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the person in charge".
- 24 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall have current valid insurance in respect of Third Party Liability and Public Liability of not less than AUD \$10million.








#### TOWER COURSE 2 – Numeral Pennant 2 Tower Start – Westerly to South Winds All marks rounded to STARBOARD








TOWER COURSE 3 — Numeral Pennant 3 Tower Start — Easterly to North Winds All marks rounded to PORT








#### BOAT COURSE 2 – Numeral Pennant 2 Boat Start – Wind in any direction All marks rounded to PORT (except for gate)

Mark 3 may be a gate







## **Appendix C: Races to Count**

#### **Club Championship Series**

A minimum of four days are required to count as a series.

When 4 to 6 race days are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of all her race day scores.

When 7 race days are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race day scores excluding her worst.

#### **Consistency Series**

When fewer than 8 race days are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of all her race day scores. When 8 to 10 race days are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race day scores, excluding her worst. When 11 or more race days are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race day scores excluding her two worst scores.

#### **Dinghy Winter Series**

A minimum of four race days are required to count as a series.

When 5 or more race days are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race day scores excluding her worst.

#### Series Notes:

A number of heats may be sailed on any race day to deliver a combined result.

RRS A8 will be applied to separate Series Ties.

Presented to the junior sailor who is trying the hardest to improve his/her sailing (Determined by the Dinghy Captain or someone selected by the Dinghy Captain).

#### Most Improved Junior Award

Presented to the junior sailor who has shown marked improvement in sailing ability since the start of the season, as shown by over the line results, improvement in racing rules knowledge, attitude and performance during training, and any races outside the club. It is determined by the Dinghy Captain or someone selected by the Dinghy Captain.


#### Most Active Junior Award
